CHARGE AHEAD COLORADO PROJECTS 2013:

American Lung Association: 1 Charging Station

The American Lung Association will receive one new charging station to be located at their facility in the Denver Tech Center. The unit will be provided to the public free of charge.

City of Arvada: 2 Charging Stations

Two new publically accessible charging stations will be located at Arvada City Hall and the Arvada Center for the Arts and Humanities. These two stations will serve as pilots with the intent of adding additional stations to the Gold Line rail stations scheduled to open in 2016.

City of Aurora: 2 Charging Stations, 3 Electric Vehicles

The City of Aurora plans to use this project as a pilot to assess the viability of electric vehicles. Both charging stations will be located in the parking garage of the Aurora Municipal Center, and the city will provide one hour of free charging to the public. The three new electric vehicles will replace conventionally fueled gasoline fueled vehicles.

City of Boulder: 4 Charging Stations, 5 Electric Vehicles

The City of Boulder is partnering with Boulder Valley School District, the Center for ReSource Conservation and eGo CarShare on this project. The new charging stations will be located at the Boulder Reservoir, Chataqua Ranger Cottage, BVSD Education Center and in a downtown parking garage. Of the five electric vehicles, two will replace older conventionally fueled vehicles.

City of Colorado Springs: 1 Charging Station

The City of Colorado Springs will add one new charging station to a public parking garage in their Central Business District. The public must pay to park in this garage but will not be required to pay an additional charging fee to fuel an electric vehicle.

City and County of Denver, Department of Environmental Health: 6 Charging Stations

Denver Department of Environmental Health will locate five new stations in Denver's Central Business District and one station in Cherry Creek. All stations will be publically accessible and provided at no additional cost beyond city parking fees.

City of Durango: 3 Charging Stations

The City of Durango will have three new publically accessible charging stations at the Durango Transit Center and in Downtown Durango. Charging will be provided at a nominal fee that is consistent with the City's hourly parking rates.

City of Fort Collins: 4 Charging Stations

The City of Fort Collins partnered with Drive Electric Northern Colorado and coordinated efforts with the City of Loveland on this project. The new publically accessible charging stations will be located at the Fort Collins Civic Center Parking Structure and Fort Collins Museum of Discovery.

City of Golden: *6 Charging Stations*

The City of Golden is partnering with Golden Urban Renewal Authority, Golden Real Estate, and the Renewable Energy Demonstration Center on this project. The new charging stations will be dispersed throughout Golden at public parking lots, the Colorado Mountaineering Museum, and a Recreation Center. These stations will be publically accessible and provided free of charge.

City of Lafayette: *2 Charging Stations*

The City of Lafayette is working with a citizen advisory committee to plan and market their project. The new charging stations will be located at the Bob L. Burger Recreation Center and City Hall. These stations will be publically accessible and provided free of charge.

City of Lakewood: *1 Charging Station, 1 Electric Vehicle*

The City of Lakewood's new charging station will be located in an underground parking structure at the City of Lakewood Police Department and Municipal Courts building. This unit will provide charging to the new electric vehicle to be used by the Investigations Division as well as Police Department and Municipal Courts city employees.

City of Loveland: *6 Charging Stations*

The City of Loveland is coordinating efforts with the City of Fort Collins on this project. Four of the new charging stations will be publically accessible and located at a local library, senior center, and the Loveland-Fort Collins Municipal Airport. Two additional stations will provide charging to city vehicles at their Service Center Building.

International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW-68): *2 Charging Stations, 1 Electric Vehicle*

IBEW-68 will locate two new charging stations at their Union Campus in North Denver. Both chargers will be publically accessible and provided free of charge, and the new electric vehicle will replace a conventionally fueled vehicle.

Pueblo County: *2 Charging Stations*

Pueblo County currently has no charging stations in the county. Through this project, the county will provide one new publically accessible station at a parking lot located at the Pueblo County Fleet Department. An additional station will provide charging to two new electric vehicles purchased by Pueblo County to replace two conventionally fueled vehicles.

Town of Carbondale: *1 Charging Station*

The Town of Carbondale will provide a new charging station at Town Hall. This station will be publically accessible and provided free of charge.
