In this capacity, she quadrupled the size of the air quality department within four years. For her efforts, she earned a merit-based promotion to the department direction position.

With Swalnick's leadership, the revenue for this department increased by more than 1,000% during her tenure. She is widely regarded as an air quality and environmental health expert, who is a contributing author to many publications and a sought-after speaker in professional forums.

As the official contact for the Clean Cities Coalition located in the Denver Metro Area, Ms. Swalnick led a coalition of more than 300 stakeholders in displacing more than 18 million gallons of petroleum.
